2. Non-Operational Intelligence.

a. Order of Battle for all Japanese forces in Southern KOREA.

(1) The following figures for troop distribution south of 35° N Lat immediately prior to US occupation were provided by Japanese representatives:

Divisional District of Seoul (Keijo)	57,110
Divisional District of Kwangju (Koshu)	34,710
Divisional District of Taegu (Taikyū)	13,480
PUSAN (FUZAN) Fortress	15,420
YOSU (REISUI) Fortress	680
Southern KOREA total	<u>121,400</u>
CHEJU-DO (SAISHU-TO)	<u>57,320</u>
Total	<u>179,720</u>

The subsequent southward withdrawal of troops has changed this distribution. Revised figures will be provided at intervals as obtained.

(2) The following list of officers in charge of communications troops in KOREA has been provided by the Japanese:

(a) Lt Col NAGAOKA Moritaka, commander of the 11th Communication Regiment (DENSHIN RENTAI), in charge of radio telegraphic communications for SAISHU-TO.

c. Progress of Demobilization.

(4) The Japanese 17th Army has food supplies for two months. The garrison at SAISHU has on hand a 6 months supply of food.
