According to police chief Chough, number of persons
registering as of April 4 was approximately 5,600,000
out of estimated 8,800,000 eligibles, which is excellent
showing as four days remain for registration.

Also to date, there has been comparatively little violence
in connection with registrations. -Only nine registration
places have been attacked, seven in Cholla Namdo and two
in Seoul. Attacks on police boxes, especially on Cheju
Island by leftist "Goon" squads (believed to be perpetrated
largely for purpose of obtaining arms) continue but this
is considered to be coincidental to registration and not
as result thereof.

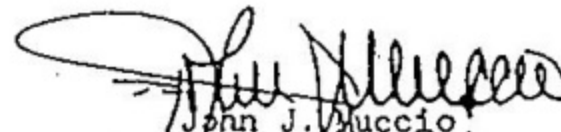

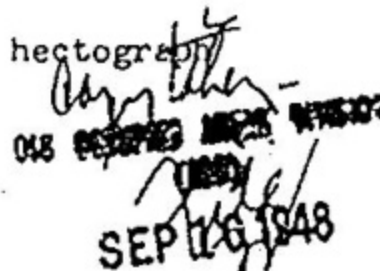

VI - PROVINCIAL BRANCH ACTIVITY

Rainy weather has had its effect on activities in the provinces during the past three or four weeks. Services, especially transportation and communication, have been disrupted by heavy rainfall. However, in the face of these handicaps, the work in the provinces has been carried on with out unduly discouraging results. Indeed, the program has moved ahead in creditable fashion.

1. Information Centers

a. Cheju Center. While the building for the Cheju center was being prepared for occupancy, a large display panel was erected in the main

square of Cheju City, and a loudspeaker set up. OCI news pictures and bulletins were posted here, and radio broadcasts of Kim Cha Rip's program, President Truman's speech, etc., were made. The project was a success, as a large and interested crowd gathered daily.

Motion-picture films have been shown to crowds of as high as 2,500 persons. Most of these have been shown in open-air places, but some have been presented in the local down-at-heels theater building. The branch manager spent a considerable portion of the month making tours of the island, where the motion pictures were received with wide acclaim. Likewise, the other output of OCI, World News, Farmer's Weekly, and leaflets.

The entire month of July was peaceful on the island, and it is hoped this condition will continue. This has enabled the branch manager to get a start which otherwise might not have been possible. It is expected that the center will be open in the near future.

PART ONE. Meetings:

Additional information 97th plenary session August 20 reveals firm decision of UNTCOK to maintain its seat in Seoul in form of main commission and remain available for consultation. Delegates in Seoul (Liu, Valle, Patterson, Luna, Singh, Paul Boncour) will proceed Lake Success as drafting committee only, with authority reserved for chairman to call plenary session outside Korea only at time report is ready for adoption. Liu indicated commission should adjourn from time General Assembly received its report, and Paul Boncour thought UNTCOK's existence would be ended by General Assembly's decision on the report.

98th plenary session August 24 devoted major attention to outline of part two of report and points to be covered. Singh and Patterson indicated their approaches to situation by observing report should include (1) lack of attempt of
