(3) Smuggling - Rice is reportedly being smuggled from the port of POKPO to JINJU by way of CHEJU-DO Island. The transporting of the rice is said to be done by persons from CHEJU-DO Island who have connections in POKPO, among whom are officers of the Police Department, who have been assisting in the activity. The smuggling of rice has caused its price to rise considerably.

(2) Smuggling - Two intercepted letters disclose smuggling activities. In the first letter written on 23 May by a woman in KOYANG (990-1660) GUN to her brother in SEOUL, there is an enclosed communication, not in the same handwriting and unsigned. It is addressed "To My Aunt". In this unsigned letter, the writer states:

"As I heard that it was easy to make a profit on mercury in KOREA, I purchased 4,000,000 yen worth and planned to take it to KOREA. However, my plan was discovered and my mercury confiscated by the Chinese. Still worse, the Chinese money, valued at 3,000,000 yen, which I brought from CHINA was seized when I tried to exchange it for Korean notes".

The second letter, written on 25 May by KIM, Tchong Ha of SEOUL to HAW, Bong Tchoon of MOKPO (950-1300), asks to confirm the information about smuggled goods on CHEJU-DO, an island off the southern coast of KOREA. "If it is true", writes KIM, "I intend to go to CHEJU-DO with some goods on the same boat by which the TAECHUNG MUL SAN (TAECHUNG Products Co.) transports their goods for trading.
