a. Communist Terrorism

Terrorism on CHEJU-DO

(1) On 26 September two boys were kidnapped and beaten by raiders at PING BAI RI (981-1155). (CIC P/R #229. C-2)

(2) On 18 September a raider was arrested by the police in SANG MYUNG NI (935-1133) and handbills and ammunition were found in his possession. This raider was allegedly the leader of several attacks and killings in the vicinity. (CIC P/R #229. C-2)

(3) Several incidents of terrorism and attacks by raiders broke out on CHEJU-DO on 01 October and according to the police were still continuing at 012100 October. Several police boxes were attacked and burned by raiders. Five policemen were killed, an unknown number of policemen were wounded, 1 United Young Men's Party member was wounded and 2 policemen were kidnapped. At 010700 October a fight between the police and members of the communist DEMOCRATIC PATRIOTIC YOUNG MEN'S ALLIANCE was in progress. Later, at 011500 October three armed raiders kidnapped four members of the UNITED YOUNG MEN'S PARTY in the vicinity of TOLLA-NI (952-1150). Three of the rightists were killed but one escaped. It is believed that in many cases raiders may be wearing Constabulary uniforms. (CIC Flash Reports. B-2)

COMMENT: Although the above reports were evaluated as B-2 by the source it is considered that at least in some cases they are police reports and might be evaluated as C-3.

Raider Activities on CHEJU-DO

On 06 October 20 CHEJU-DO policemen engaged in a firefight with 40 armed raiders in the vicinity of KUMNYONG (975-1157). One policeman was wounded. (CIC Flash Report. C-2)

During Constabulary operations in the southern portion of CHEJU-DO on 06 October one battalion made contact with approximately 40 armed raiders in the vicinity of CHANG DAL LI (940-1122). In the firefight which developed 1 Constabularyman was killed and 4 were wounded. Raider casualties are unknown. (CIC Flash Report. C-2)

b. Submarine Sighted off CHEJU-DO

On 08 October an unidentified submarine was sighted off the coast of CHEJU-DO, approximately 10 miles north of CHEJU City. The submarine was flying a white flag on which was a red star. (Kimpo Report. A-1)

Raiders Arrested on CHEJU-DO (Delayed Report)

During recent operations on CHEJU-DO the constabulary arrested 800 persons. These prisoners are being screened to determine if any are connected with the CHEJU-DO People's Army. (CIC P/R #238. B-2)

b. Raider Terrorism and Attacks on CHEJU-DO

(1) At 230445 October raiders fired approximately 100 rounds at CHEJU CITY (962-1153) and the police box located on the East side of the town. No damages resulted. (CIC Flash Report. A-2)

(2) At 230730 October a constabulary jeep, containing the executive officer and 4 enlisted men of the 9th Regiment, Korean Constabulary, was ambushed by raiders on road west of CHUCHUN-LI (965-1155). The executive officer and 2 enlisted men were wounded. (CIC Flash Report. A-2)
