1. ARMED FORCESNORTH WEST YOUNG MEN'S ASSOCIATION Members Trained by Police

Approximately 620 volunteers from the NORTH WEST YOUNG MEN'S ASSOCIATION have recently undergone a 12-day training period under supervision of the SEOUL Metropolitan Police. After the completion of the training these men were placed on regular police status and assigned to YOSU (1080-1300), CHEJU-DO and KANGWON-DO. The present plan is that these personnel will complete a month's tour of duty in these areas in which disturbances have occurred and will then be replaced and returned to SEOUL for duty. (B-2)

According to the chief of Administration of the Metropolitan Police, members of no other youth groups have yet offered their services. Members of the UNITED YOUNG MEN'S PARTY and the NSAKI YOUTH CORPS have stated that their organizations have been given the opportunity to join the police force, but as yet there have been no volunteers. (B-3)

COMMENT: This report of NYMA members actually joining the police force and receiving training confirms a previous report (P/R #1005) that the NYMA planned to furnish personnel for both the police and constabulary.

(2) Civilians Assist Constabulary on CHEJU-DO

On 14 December the Constabulary on CHEJU-DO were supported by 3,000 civilians during four joint operations in a concerted effort to eliminate raiders near MOSULPO (920-1110), SOGWI PO (950-1110), HAMWON NI (970-1120) and HALLA SAN (950-1130). These four operations resulted in 105 raiders killed, 10 Japanese "99" rifles captured and foodstuffs confiscated. Constabulary and civilian casualties are not known. (Constabulary Report)

COMMENT: The civilians on CHEJU DO are continuing to assist the authorities in ever increasing numbers by combing the hills for guerrillas, probably to retaliate for indiscriminate guerrilla activity against their villages (see page 9, W/S #166).

Constabulary (Secret)

The Korean Military Academy, established to train officer personnel for the Constabulary, began its first training, initially to be of 5 months duration, on 11 December. Approximately 1,100 cadets are enrolled for the first session.

COMMENT: The enrollment of 1,100 cadets in the KMA is considered by both the American Advisors to the Constabulary and the Constabulary staff to be in excess of the physical capacity, housing and training facilities, and the number of capable instructors available. It is considered that the normal school capacity, for proper training, is 500 students, with an absolute
