e. Mail Interceptions

(2) A routine police report (SEO/2933) from the chief of the CHEJU Police Division to the chief of the First Administrative Police Division, is quoted in part:

"This is a report on illegal acts of some men of the Coast Defense Garrison. (Note: Korean Coast Guard).

"According to a report made by a man named CHANG who lives in CHEJU DO¹, some dishonest members of the Coast Defense Garrison who are on patrol off PUSAN often buy up goods and bootleg them the same as though they were profiteers when they detect smuggling ships that are on the way back to KOREA from JAPAN with merchandise. They are also easily bribed. They usually give tacit consent and overlook smugglers when they have been bribed with a large amount of money."

(2) Legislative Notes - Meeting on 13 January with seventy-one members present, the Interim Legislative Assembly saw the following members take the oath of office:

Dr KIM, Kyu Sik, presiding chairman, read General HODGE's letter which disclosed the fact that the General has advised LYUH, Woon Hyung and CHANG, Kun Sang, Leftist appointees who have thus far declined their seats, that they must register with the Assembly before 15 January or lose their memberships. Also, the letter stated that the General has directed the governor of CHEJU DO to proceed with the election of two members to replace those Leftists from that province who previously had refused to take their seats.

(2) Possible Killing of US Army Interpreters During New Riots (SEO/2956)
A police report from the Chief of the CHEJU Inspection Office to the Chief of First Administrative Area Police Division states as follows:

"Report on rioters who plan to kill American Occupation Force interpreters.

"According to a report made to us by a man named PAIK, 42 years old, who lives near the DONGMOON TONG market, ILLTO-LI, CHEJU-ERP, CHEJU-DO, who has just returned from WOKPO, the disturbances there seem to have quieted down for the time being.

"However, among the people there it is said that when the new riots break out, the rioters have planned to kill the interpreters for the American Occupation Forces."

a. Rice Collection - Released on 21 January are the following figures relative to the status of the rice collection program as of 18 January:

CHUNGCHONG PUKTO	86%	KYONGSANG NAMDO	89%

For all of South KOREA 69.5% of the entire quota has been collected.

It is interesting to note that CHEJU DO, with a quota of 5,000 suk, and KANGYON DO, with a quota of 60,000 suk, are the least productive provinces in South KOREA; therefore, the success or failure of the rice collection program will not depend on either province. However, the problem in CHOLLA PUKTO is more serious. In this province the Communists have centered their propaganda and anti-Military Government activity as an organized deterrent to the successful gathering of the 798,000 suk quota. Increased effort on the part of Military Government is responsible for recent gains in the collection program, however, opposition remains strong. (See par 4b (2), W/S #66).

e. Mail Interceptions

(4) Great Profit in Smuggling - LEE, Doo Ok, M.KSERPO, CHEJU-DO, in a letter to KIM, Chong Che of YONGCHERNG-LI, KANGYON-DO, states that the profits obtained from one smuggling trip to JAPAN are so great that they overcome the possibility of confiscation of ship and cargo in case of detection. LEE further states that he will never give up until he succeeds in smuggling goods to foreign countries. (CS#XO/3024, letter dated 31 December 1946).
