Rebels attacked a small village near the CHEJU air strip (940-1150) on 19 February. In the ensuing fight 26 rebels and 1 policeman were killed and 1 policeman was wounded. (Police Report)

c. Weekly Violence Summarized

(3) 19 Feb - CHEJU Airstrip (940-1150), CHEJU-DO. Rebels attack village and in ensuing fight 26 rebels and 1 policeman killed. One policeman was wounded.

d. Delayed Reports Which Have Not Been Previously Summarized. (See P/R #1067)

(5) 16 Feb - DODU-R1 (940-1150), CHEJU-DO. Police clash with rebels who had attacked a village. Thirty-four rebels and 6 civilians killed, 2 rebels captured, and 16 civilians wounded.

Civil Unrest

(1) CHEJU-DO

A delayed report indicates that on 20 February, 76 rebels from TODU-R1 (948-1141) were executed by the MIN BO DAN (Peoples Protective Corps), who used spears in the performance of these executions. Five women and numerous children of middle school age were included in the group. National Police and KUNGI DAI (Korean Army Military Police) supervised the operation. (KA Report)

COMMENT: Four members of KMAO witnessed, by chance, the execution of 38 of the rebels and counted 38 already dead when they arrived. Previous reports have indicated that rebels were being executed by Armed Forces personnel, before a firing squad. This is the first report of a mass execution being conducted by the MIN BO DAN.

c. Organize CHEJU FRIENDSHIP ASSOCIATION

The CHEJU FRIENDSHIP ASSOCIATION, avowedly organized to promote the welfare of people on the troubled island of CHEJU, is being organized in South Korean mainland cities.

With a membership confined to former residents of CHEJU-DO, the group is suspected of fronting for the communists. (C-3)

CHEJU-DO

a. Security Forces attacked a group of rebels near AEWOL-L1 (930-1140) on 7 March. Two rebels, 2 soldiers and 1 civilian were killed. Ten rebels were captured. (KA Report)

b. Five rebels were killed and 20 were captured when joint forces of the police and KA raided a rebel hide-out near KANGAU-SA Temple (956-1145) on 6 March. (KA Report)

c. Delayed reports for 4 and 5 March indicate that 3 rebels were killed and 32 were captured in 2 engagements near SANGHWAJON (930-1130) between rebels and Security Forces. (KA Report)
