

(2) In Korean Army operations on CHEJU-DO on 18 April 4 rebels were killed, and 92 were captured, while 1 KA officer and 9 members of the MIN SO DAE were killed. One M-1 rifle was recovered from the guerrillas. (3-2)

b. Security Force Operation Against Rebels

(3) Korean Army units killed 15 and captured 172 rebels on CHEJU-DO on 21 April. The Army units confiscated 2 automatic rifles, 5 carbines, 1 M-1 rifle, 10 Japanese rifles, and 1 pistol. (C-2)

(4) On 23 April National police captured one rebel and confiscated 30 rounds of carbine ammunition on CHEJU-DO. (C-3)

b. CHANG Taik Sang To Run on CHEJU-DO

CHANG Taik Sang, former Minister of Foreign Affairs, who has been unsuccessful in 2 attempts in recent months to gain an Assembly seat (P/Rs #1097 and #1040), will run in the CHEJU-DO elections on 10 May.

Seventeen candidates will vie for the two seats (P/R #1101) which have been left vacant for a year because of disturbed conditions on the island. (B-2)

COMMENT: In KOREA any office seeker can run for election wherever he chooses without regard for geographical or political divisions or established place of residence. CHANG was previously defeated in by-elections in KYONGSANG-PURTO and SEOUL, and there seems little likelihood that his CHEJU-DO campaign will be any more successful.

b. North Korean Submarine Base in YONGHUNG Bay Area (1040-1860)(Confidential)

The North Korean government has established a submarine base in the YONGHUNG Bay area for the purpose of supplying guerrilla organizations in South KOREA. There are reportedly 3 submarines assigned to this base, described as "German P Type" submarines.
