

(2) In Korean Army operations on CHEJU-DO on 18 April 4 rebels were killed, and 92 were captured, while 1 KA officer and 9 members of the MIN SO DAE were killed. One M-1 rifle was recovered from the guerrillas. (3-2)

b. Security Force Operation Against Rebels

(3) Korean Army units killed 15 and captured 172 rebels on CHEJU-DO on 21 April. The Army units confiscated 2 automatic rifles, 5 carbines, 1 M-1 rifle, 10 Japanese rifles, and 1 pistol. (C-2)

(4) On 23 April National police captured one rebel and confiscated 30 rounds of carbine ammunition on CHEJU-DO. (C-3)

b. CHANG Taik Sang To Run on CHEJU-DO

CHANG Taik Sang, former Minister of Foreign Affairs, who has been unsuccessful in 2 attempts in recent months to gain an Assembly seat (P/Rs #1097 and #1040), will run in the CHEJU-DO elections on 10 May.

Seventeen candidates will vie for the two seats (P/R #1101) which have been left vacant for a year because of disturbed conditions on the island. (B-2)

COMMENT: In KOREA any office seeker can run for election wherever he chooses without regard for geographical or political divisions or established place of residence. CHANG was previously defeated in by-elections in KYONGSANG-PURTO and SEOUL, and there seems little likelihood that his CHEJU-DO campaign will be any more successful.

b. North Korean Submarine Base in YONGHUNG Bay Area (1040-1860)(Confidential)

The North Korean government has established a submarine base in the YONGHUNG Bay area for the purpose of supplying guerrilla organizations in South KOREA. There are reportedly 3 submarines assigned to this base, described as "German P Type" submarines.

The Commandant of the base is KANG Pa, who is approximately 42 years of age. He was graduated from the Department of Navigation, Higher Merchant Marine School, OSAKA, JAPAN, and in 1943 was commanding a 3,000-ton merchant vessel. This vessel ran aground in Chinese Communist-held territory in 1943, and KANG Pa remained with the Chinese Communists until the end of World War II when he was repatriated to North KOREA. In 1947 he was sent by the North Korean government to a submarine training school in VLADIVOSTOK. KANG is a native of CHEJU-DO.

The political commissar of the submarine base and fleet is KO Chi San, who is also a native of CHEJU-DO. He was with KANG when the latter's vessel ran aground in 1943.

By March of 1949, 3 successful cargo transport missions had been made to CHEJU-DO. The type of cargo was not identified but it is presumed to have been arms, ammunition, communications equipment and propaganda materials. (F-6)

COMMENT: While unconfirmed rumors of submarine sightings off CHEJU-DO have circulated in South KOREA there is no evidence that lends credence to those rumors. Since the use of submarines in supporting isolated guerrilla units logistically has been proven possible, it is possible that North KOREA does have a submarine base. The source of the above information says that he knows KANG Pa very well, and states that KANG is a well qualified naval officer.

d. CHEJU-DO

According to South Korean sources, a recapitulation of Security forces and rebel losses on CHEJU-DO from 01 March to 30 April list the following: 1,075 rebels killed; 3,509 rebels taken prisoner; 2,055 rebels surrendered; captured from rebels 3 B.A.R.'s, 23 M-1 rifles, 26 carbines, 24 Japanese model 38 rifles, 4 Japanese model-44 rifles, 105 Japanese model 99 rifles and 8 pistols; 32 Security force members killed; 17 wounded in action; 2 MG's, 4 M-1 rifles and 2 carbines captured by rebels. (C-4)

COMMENT: The apparently large number of "rebels" mentioned in this report can be justified when it is considered that all residents of the mountainous interior of the island are automatically classified as rebels by Security Forces.
