PEOPLE'S COMMITTEE OF THE KOREAN PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC:

The following information was prepared by the CIC in answer to thirteen specific questions concerning the PEOPLE'S COMMITTEE'S of KOREA. The information related may be generally evaluated as above B-2 and in many instances as A-1. The report follows:

1. DOES AN UNDERGROUND PEOPLE'S COMMITTEE (COMMUNIST) GOVERNMENT EXIST?

Yes, an underground PEOPLE'S COMMITTEE government exists in certain parts of South KOREA. Such a government or underground organization is known to exist in CHULLA PUKTO, CHULLA NAMDO, KYONGSANG PUKTO, KYONGSANG NAMDO, CHEJU DO, and in various isolated cities or districts in other provinces of South KOREA, namely: CHUNCHON, SUWON, SAMCHOCK, CHUMINJIN, and most provincial capitols. Until 12 December 1945, the PEOPLE'S COMMITTEES existed as an open government. At this time the PEOPLE'S COMMITTEES were dissolved by an order of the Commanding General, and necessarily went underground in order to exist. In the more distant GUNS and MYUNS the PEOPLE'S COMMITTEES continued to control the government until middle January 1946. There are long lists of leaders and members of the PEOPLE'S COMMITTEES throughout South KOREA. The majority of these lists were prepared just before the organization was disbanded; however, several lists were prepared after that date, showing that the organization continued under the same leadership after it had been placed on the illegal list.

20. CHEJU DO (950-1150)(33°30'N-126°32'E)

06 September 47 - CHEJU CIC reports that Japanese ammunition was found at HALLIM, HALLIM MYUN, CHEJU DO Harbor, by diving girls. This ammunition had been buried by the Japanese during the war. There is approximately six to seven thousands rounds for rifles and about twenty rounds of approximately 105 mm.

19 October 47 - Another membership drive has again led to terroristic acts by the members of the UNITED YOUNG MEN'S PARTY in small villages on the eastern end of CHEJU DO. The terroristic acts are being investigated by CIC. (CIC P/R #670)

(3) CHEJU DO (950-1150) (33°30'N-126°52'E)

17 November 47 - After a widespread campaign of terrorism to collect funds for their association in the CHEJU DO area, members of the NORTHWEST YOUTH ASSOCIATION, were warned by CIC and local police, about their unlawful activities. After being so warned, the ASSOCIATION members apologized to CIC and faithfully promised to behave in the future. (CIC S/I)
