CHRONOLOGICAL SUMMARY: APRIL, MAY, JUNE 1948
(See W/S #133 for C. S. of preceding period)

03 April Serious rioting begins on Cheju-do.
08 April Cheju-do rioting figures show 19 killed since 3 April (4 police, 12 Rightist civilians, 3 Communists), 21 wounded (5 police, 16 Rightists), 3 police and 4 Rightists are missing.
01 May Eight American dependents are evacuated from Cheju-do as fresh raids break out.
02 May Six people are killed in May Day violence on Cheju-do.
10 May More than 6,000,000 of the 7,000,000 registered voters go to the polls in Korea's first election.
26 May Major General John B. Coulter is announced as Deputy Commander, USAFIK and XXIV Corps.
01 June Civil Administrator AHN Chai Hong submits resignation, effective 08 June.
08 June Several Korean fishing boats are bombed by Japan-based U.S. aircraft off Dok-Do (Liancourt Rocks). Fourteen Koreans reported killed.
10 June Military Governor postpones Cheju-do elections for an indefinite period.
19 June Colonel PAK Chin Kyung, commander of the Korean Constabulary in Cheju-do, is fatally shot while asleep in his quarters.

c. Constabulary Action on CHEJU-DO

South Korean Constabulary action on CHEJU-DO was limited to a regrouping of troops. The 11th Regiment, which was located on CHEJU-DO is scheduled to close in the SU-ON (1102-1609), area, 23 July. Two battalions of the 3rd Brigade, to be attached to the 9th Regiment moved from PUSAN to CHEJU-DO on 21 July.

(1) At 170400 August the South Korean Coast Guard cutter "K.M. GJU" attempted to intercept a Soviet 500 ton vessel beyond the 3-mile limit off CHEJU-DO. The vessel made a 90° turn as if to run the cutter. (B-2)

Small groups of guerrilla forces, consisting of staff and training personnel, are reportedly in the CHEJU-DO Mountains. Guerrilla headquarters is not stationary, but moves frequently to avoid police and Constabulary action.
