(2) A delayed report from the Japanese 17th Area Army states that on 211400 September ships laden with explosives caught fire in the quay of MUSIPPPO (believed to be MUSULPO, SAISHU) (920-1110), and several serious explosions resulted. Some 73 persons were injured. It is reported that 3 or 4 ships were sunk; the quay cannot be used for an indefinite period.
