According to two recently intercepted letters, pirate bands are active in the Korea Strait. The writer stated that 5,000 Koreans returning from Japan in November were robbed by bands of pirates while crossing the Strait. The other writer reported that such bands are organized by the Japanese and natives of CHEJU-DO Island, off the South coast of Korea.

- a. On 28 Dec 45, a sentry on CHEJU-DO Island (951 - 1149) caught several Koreans attempting to steal foodstuffs from a Japanese dump. As he approached, they turned and fled. The sentry ordered them to halt and opened fire when they refused. One Korean, a woman, was shot and died later.
