

leftists, suspected of participation in recent disturbances, were picked up through the combined efforts of the police and constabulary. The police proceeded to raid houses suspected of harboring members of raiding parties, while the constabulary served to block off certain areas of the town. Thirty of the leftist suspects were held for a thorough screening. No violence occurred during the period of the search. Many of the raiders have been identified as members of the South Korea Labor Party and the Democratic People's Front. (A-2)

b. Civil disturbances by Province.

(2) Cheju-Do:

CHEJU-DO AIRSTRIP (9480 - 1152) - At 1315, 24 April 48, five rounds of small arms fire were directed at a C-47 plane as it descended onto the strip. Two men who were observed to be firing, escaped. (A-1)

3. Civil Relations.

Civil Disturbances by Province.

Cheju-Do:

- a. SAMYANG-NI (9508 - 1154) - At 0330, 26 April 48, six raiders attacked the town. One wounded raider was captured but died during the trip to the local police station. (B-2)
- b. PUKCHON-NI (9609 - 1156) - (Delayed report) - At 2300, 21 April 48, an unknown number of raiders attacked a voting office and stole all registration records. No casualties were reported. (B-2)
- c. SANDONG-NI (9708 - 1147) - During the night of 21-22 April 48, raiders attacked the town. One raider was killed; another wounded and captured. (B-2)
- d. CHOCCHUN-NI (9603 - 1155) - On 24 April 48, police arrested the alleged local propaganda chief of the South Korea Labor Party. (SKIP) While the man was showing the police an assembly area, used by the SKIP, he tried to escape but was killed in the attempt. (B-2)

2. Counterintelligence.

Subversive Activity.

a. Sabotage.

- (1) CHEJU-UP (951 - 1151) - During the period, 1200, 26 April 48, to 0800, 27 April 48, telephone lines between CHEJU-UP and SOGWI-RI (955 - 1119) were cut. (A-1)
- (2) CHEBI-AK Mountain (905 - 1145) - During the evening of 24 April 48, two Koreans were killed by the police, when discovered cutting the telephone lines during an attack on a police box. (B-2)
- (3) YONGPYONG-NI (957 - 1148) - On 27 April 48, the road into the town was ditched to prevent entrance. (A-1)

c. Illegal Activity of a Subversive Nature.

- (3) CHOCHON-NI (963 - 1154) - Twentieth Infantry patrols picked up handbills which urged the natives to organize against the police. (A-1)

Civil Disturbances by Province.

c. Cheju-Do:

SO-DONG (958 - 1149) - (not on map) - On 27 April 48, the police and a raiding group met and exchanged fire. One member of the group was captured but no casualties were reported. Machine guns were used by the group. (A-1)

5. Miscellaneous.

- ✓ a. At coordinates (953 - 1148) - on 26 April 48, the bodies of five Koreans were found whom the natives in the immediate area stated were killed by the police. Local officials are of the opinion that the five were killed after they had surrendered to a raiding party. (B-2)

NAEDO-RI (942 - 1149) - On 28 April 48, a patrol reported new road blocks constructed and Korean telephone lines destroyed in villages of NAEDO-RI and HACHU-RI (940 - 1139). (B-2)

WOLSAN-DONG (940 - 1147) - (not on map) - On 28 April 48, 20th Infantry patrols picked up handbills demanding the deaths of KIM, Koo and RHEE,
