

2. Counterintelligence.

Subversive Activity.

a. Sabotage.

- (1) CHEJU-UP (951 - 1151) - During the period, 1200, 26 April 48, to 0800, 27 April 48, telephone lines between CHEJU-UP and SOGWI-RI (955 - 1119) were cut. (A-1)
- (2) CHEJU-AK Mountain (905 - 1145) - During the evening of 24 April 48, two Koreans were killed by the police, when discovered cutting the telephone lines during an attack on a police box. (B-2)
- (3) YONGPYONG-NI (957 - 1148) - On 27 April 48, the road into the town was ditched to prevent entrance. (A-1)

c. Illegal Activity of a Subversive Nature.

- (3) CHOCHON-NI (963 - 1154) - Twentieth Infantry patrols picked up handbills which urged the natives to organize against the police. (A-1)

3. Civil Relations.

Civil Disturbances by Province.

c. Cheju-Do:

SO-DONG (958 - 1149) - (not on map) - On 27 April 48, the police and a raiding group met and exchanged fire. One member of the group was captured but no casualties were reported. Machine guns were used by the group. (A-1)

5. Miscellaneous.

- ✓ a. At coordinates (953 - 1148) - on 26 April 48, the bodies of five Koreans were found whom the natives in the immediate area stated were killed by the police. Local officials are of the opinion that the five were killed after they had surrendered to a raiding party. (B-2)

Subversive Activity.

a. Sabotage.

NAEDO-RI (942 - 1149) - On 28 April 48, a patrol reported new road blocks constructed and Korean telephone lines destroyed in villages of NAEDO-RI and HACHU-RI (940 - 1139). (B-2)

c. Illegal Activity of a Subversive Nature.

WOLSAN-DONG (940 - 1147) - (not on map) - On 28 April 48, 20th Infantry patrols picked up handbills demanding the deaths of KIM, Koo and RHEE,

Syng Man, in order that a "free, united Korea may be established."
(B-2)

Civil Disturbances by Province.

b. Cheju-Do:

- (1) SINAM-NI (935 - 1147) - At 0330, 28 April 48, fourteen men, armed with U.S. Carbines and grenades, attacked the town. Currently, detailed information has not been supplied. (B-2)
- (2) SINAM-NI (935 - 1147) - On the evening of 27 April 48, the Gun Master and six local officials were attacked while returning from election duties in HALLAK (925 - 1139). Police dispersed the attackers without casualties. (B-2)
- (3) HAK-BAK (958 - 1153) - (not on map) - At 1630, 27 April 48, the village head was kidnapped by unknown persons. (B-2)

Subversive Activity.

a. Sabotage.

✓ CHEJU-UP (951 - 1152) - During the morning of 1 May 48, telephone lines from CHEJU-UP to HALLAK-RI (940 - 1148) were cut. (B-2)

b. Terrorism.

✓ (1) TOPYONG-NI (944 - 1149) - At 1300, 1 May 48, the chairman of an Election Committee was stabbed to death by unknown assailants. Police are investigating. (B-2)

3. Civil Relations.

Civil Disturbances by Province.

✓ Cheju-Do:

ORA-RI (951 - 1149) - At 1530, 1 May 48, police arrived to disperse a group of raiders who were attacking the village. The attackers fled. Entering the town, police found two men killed, one woman hanged, and one woman killed by a sword thrust. (B-2)
