- b. TAEJONG (926 - 1120) - At 1430, 25 May 48, a cadet policeman was reported by police to have been killed by unknown persons. Additional details are being sought.

3. Civil Relations.

Civil Disturbances by Province.

Cheju-Do:

- a. At coordinates (945 - 1140) on 26 May 48, seven raiders, armed with one Jap rifle and 100 rounds of ammunition were captured by Constabulary units and also captured thirteen raiders in the vicinity of coordinates (907 - 1141). All prisoners are being held at CHEJU (952 - 1152). (B-2)
- b. JUNGK HAN (933 - 1125) - (Delayed) - At 0600, 23 May 48, police reported an estimated 100 raiders, forty of whom were armed with rifles; the remainder with spears, attacked a local police box. No casualties were reported. The police box was damaged. (C-3)
- c. SOHONG-RI (905 - 1121) - At 0130, 25 May 48, ten raiders attacked the village, killing three natives and wounding three others. (Police report)

✓ Cheju-Do:

PONGYAE-RI (959 - 1149) - On the morning of 30 May 48, police entered this village in which raiders had taken refuge. Fleeing raiders set fire to police stores of ammunition and dynamite. (B-2)

• Cheju-Do:

An unconfirmed police report states that on 2 June 48, three separate groups of approximately forty men each attacked the towns of CHONCHON-NI (963 - 1154), HAMKONG-NI (963 - 1155) and KUMYONG (974 - 1156). No casualties were reported.

5. Miscellaneous.

✓ KWIDONG-NI (928 - 1144) - On the morning of 2 June 48, police raided the town taking fifteen prisoners and killing one man who attempted to escape. The man had South Korea Labor Party documents in his possession. (B-2)

Civil Disturbances by Province.

Cheju-Do:

- a. SANGCHON-NI (939 - 1127) - At 0400, 1 June 48, police surprised a party of twenty raiders, killing six. Details are being sought. (B-3)
- b. SOHUNG-NI (955 - 1121) - At 1600, 2 June 48, police encountered a group of an unknown number of raiders. In the ensuing action three raiders were killed. (B-3)
- c. SANGHWAJON (939 - 1132) - At 2000, 1 June 48, police encountered seventeen armed raiders. During a ten-minute fight two raiders were killed. (B-3)
- d. CHOCHON-NI (963 - 1154) - At 0030, 2 June 48, raiders attacked the town from three directions. Police repulsed the attackers after forty minutes of fighting. No casualties were reported. (B-3)

Cheju-Do:

KUMANG-NI (928 - 1133) - On 12 June 48, police from CHEJI-RI (925 - 1130) - report that they met a group of raiders. In the ensuing fight, which lasted several hours, three raiders were killed and three policemen were wounded. (police report)
