(1) Police Chief Perturbed

The Chief of Police of CHEJU DO in a letter to the Chief in PUSAN states: "During my recent visit to PUSAN harbor, I discovered many trading ships whose destinations were ports in areas North of the 38th parallel. On investigation of this situation, I learned that extensive international trade is secretly being conducted by these ships, between areas South and North of the 38th Parallel. I fear a very serious international trade problem, unless something is done to prevent illegal sailings of this sort." (PUS/1753)

a. Civil Unrest

(1) Grain Collection Officials Beaten

Three men of a government grain collection committee were beaten by approximately 50 people at TONG KWANG-MI, ANDOK-MYUN (933-1127) last week in a flare-up protest against the grain collection. (CIC S/I)

(6) Grain Collection Officials Attacked

Approximately 50 persons made a recent night attack against three provincial government grain collection officials in CHEJU (950-1150). At the start of the attack a lighted lantern in the officials' quarters was snuffed out by a stone thrown by one of the attackers. The mob then beat the three officials with sticks. Police arrested three suspects the following day. (CIC S/I)

Two policemen were beaten and one woman was accidentally wounded when a crowd of approximately 200 people attacked a police box at HANDOK (965-1155) on CHEJU island last week. Police reinforcements restored order. (6th Division P/R #665)

(3) Leftist Handbills Oppose Grain Collection

Leftists are distributing handbills throughout CHEJU (950-1150) this month which propagandize against the grain collection. "...let us oppose the compulsory grain collection program by which murdering police will be distributed five hops a day and rascals, terrorist members of the KWANGBOK YOUNG MEN'S ASSOCIATION (rightist strong-arm group), will satisfy their stomachs", the handbills read. Suffixed to the leftist message is the summary, "...let us oppose the grain collection at any cost". (CIC S/I)

(2) Two Beatings Reported Against Leftists

From CHEJU (950-1150) comes the report that the 47 year-old wife of a prominent leftist in that town was beaten on 07 September and is now recovering from a broken arm. A preliminary check shows that just prior to this assault a telephone call was received by her and some unknown person, who claimed to be a police representative, said he wanted to be allowed entrance to the house to search for any papers. A check by CIC at the telephone office revealed that the only call to this house had been made from the home of a high provincial official who is reputed to be an advisor to the right-wing KWANGBOK YOUNG MEN'S ASSOCIATION (CIC P/R #637)

6. MISCELLANEOUS

(1) Rifle, 105 MM Ammunition Found Off CHEJU-DO

A cache of Japanese ammunition was discovered in the water off HALLIM, HALLIM MYUN, CHEJU-DO. Found were approximately six to seven thousand rounds of rifle ammunition and about 20 rounds of approximately 105 MM ammunition. This ammunition was buried by the Japanese during the war. Diving girls discovered the cache. (CIC P/R #637)
