a. Disturbances

(2) Civil Disturbances From 13 June to 13 September In 6th Division Zone

The tempo of civil disturbances in the 6th Infantry Division zone of responsibility is still increasing. Records disclose that a total of 202 riots and disturbances have taken place in 127 different cities and towns, during the past three months. This is a daily average of 2.2 riots and disturbances.

The undeclared civil war between rightists and leftists is at the present time causing most of the disturbances. A summary of disturbances by provinces follows: (6th Division P/R #700)

(1) 500 Students Attack Middle School

Approximately 500 students of the CHEJU Agricultural school demolished a building of the CHEJU Boys' Middle School on 15 September because the middle school students were classified by the other students as "pro-Japanese". The destroyed building was a Japanese-built structure which housed classrooms. (CIC P/R #647)
