CHRONOLOGICAL LISTING OF PAPERS
(With brief comments)

- 256 9 April 48 Daily Report of UNC, 8 April. Observation trip to Chon Chon showed excellent results. Milner, on 7 April, expressed acute interest in situation on Cheju Do. Chough quieted his fears. Milner, without any provocation, presented a spirited laudation of Mr. Jackson. Supposedly misunderstood. Miss McFarland upheld Patterson.
- 263 12 April 48 (Spec Report 118) Report by Manet of Group I on Cheju Do situation. General impression was good despite rioting and evidences of pressure tactics. Rioting situation serious enough for Gen Hodge to declare martial law which would enable him to suspend the elections.
