



16. Something unique in the field of "women's work" is the daily life of "the weaker sex" on Cheju Island, a romantic spot off the southwestern coast of Korea. Here oranges grow and Korean women dive for rare shell-fish and seaweed. The role of Cheju's women is exactly opposite to the general pattern of Oriental customs. Here women are in the majority and control the men. While men are of a healthy, athletic type of beauty dive, and fish from boats. According to ancient legend, there was a time when men were allowed on the island only for brief periods, and in small numbers, once a year. When boys reached adolescence, they were sent to the mainland. Today there still are more women than men on the island.
