

elements in the army at Yosu and Suncheon last October was promptly put down. Rebels who fled into the Chiri mountains were captured and their attempts to inflame the people against the government failed.

"Repeated Communist attacks across the 38th parallel have all been steadily and substantially increased in size and improved in quality. In the test of difficult mountain fighting on Cheju Island, in the Chiri mountains, on the Ongjin Peninsula, and all along the 38th parallel, the high morale and tenacious fighting ability of our troops have repeatedly been proved. The seamanship and courage of our Coast Guard have thrown a thin but determined shield around our long coastline. Police cooperating with local officers and general public have demonstrated their high sense of loyalty and responsibility.

"Following the withdrawal of the last American troops, my statement of last April that the Republic of Korea would be fully capable of maintaining internal security--except in the case of a full-scale attack from outside--has been fully substantiated by the event.

"In the homes and villages, in the cities and country districts of Southern Korea, our people have remained loyal and steadfast, despite the propaganda, threats and murderous attacks by our Communist foe.

"Bolstered by the same love of freedom and independence that kept us a liberty-seeking nation under forty years of Japanese rule and which kept us determined for self-rule during three years of division and occupation, the people of Korea have not faltered during this difficult first year of the Republic.

~~"We have met the difficult first year of the Republic.~~
We have met the challenge of establishing a new government of our own under men and women unused to the technical administrative processes of large-scale democratic operations. We have woven together the long traditions of our 4000-year old history and the new formulations of modern democratic theory into a solid fabric of successful government. And we have done it while under a threat as great as that faced by any people anywhere in the world.

UNCOK Report
Chapter III

41. The role of the Police in the maintenance of law and order is dealt with in another place in this report. Almost the entire burden of maintaining security along the 38th parallel has until recently fallen on the Police, who at first, also played a primary role in the suppression of large-scale disorders in the southern provinces and on Cheju-do. The Army, however, has recently taken over larger responsibilities along the parallel and in dealing with large-scale disturbances. The outbreak in Cholla Nardo, which began with the mutiny of an Army unit, was suppressed by the Army, and the pacification of Cheju-do had finally to be entrusted to the Army, which completed the operation in May 1949.
